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Rainwater! Rainwater is the softest water found in nature, but it is not as pure as generally thought. Rainwater is purest when collected at the end of a shower, when **much** of the impurities of the air have been washed out. It has been found that precipitation is purer in winter than in summer. More active convectional currents in summer carry all sorts of dust particles high up in the air. Rain brings down ammonia, nitrates, and common salts. The nitrogen in the nitrates varies from seven hundredths to four tenths of a pound per acre for every inch of rain; and the salt averages about one pound per acre for each inch.
