Now half a million people are carried annually as passengers. This large transportation service requires the best weather information possible. This is given by the U.S. Weather Bureau, whose largest division, the aerological, deals mostly with the air service. In addition, many air lines have their own meteorologists who cooperate with the Weather Bureau to give the air lines up-to-the-minute data and advice as to future weather. In many cities the Weather Bureau has two stations, one in the heart of the city and another at the airport.
