Home gardens! In many parts of the country, particularly on the eastern slope of the Rockies, thunderstorms are most frequent this month, so the gardener must work between showers. In the North he should continue to plant sweet corn, bush beans, beets, carrots, and kohlrabi, and sow rutabaga turnips and late beets for winter. Start pumpkins, squash and melons if not done last month. Set out celery plants, first soaking the ground. In the South set out sweet potatoes started late, and sow parsnips and vegetable oysters. Continue planting beans and corn through the season, and cucumbers for late pickles. For next winter plant beets^{and} rutabagas
