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Weather travels! Or you can travel to get the weather. In a well-developed cyclone, or storm, there are all sorts of weather: in the eastern part, warm and rain; in the western part, cold and fair; while in the lower half there may be a wind shift line with thunder and lightning. So if you will hire an airplane with a speed of 200 miles an hour, you can cross an average cyclone in six or seven hours and witness in this short time the whole panorama of changing weather. Or if the storm, as it travels, passes over your home, you can witness the same thing from your own doorstep. But you must patiently watch it for about two days, since cyclones are about 1200 miles wide and travel about 30 miles per hour.
