Wind and climate! Most of us think that our climate depends upon our latitude or distance from the equator. Yet between the tropics and the polar regions, the climate is really controlled by the winds. Note how different the weather is with a change of the wind. In the eastern United State and Canada a west wind is warm in summer and cold in winter. Winds give character to a climate much more decidedly than latitude. There are places, however, even in the middle latitudes, which have their own climate as they are cut off from winds by high mountains. Winds on the whole have a stimulating effect on man and are conducive to active work and vigorous mental effort.
