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Across the Pacific. Favorable weather may be expected in August for those who expect to travel the North Pacific Ocean. Winds of gale velocity are rare. There are, however, occasional storms east and northeast of Japan which come up from the tropics. Tropical typhoons are likely to occur anywhere north of latitude 10 and west of longitude 150; these average about four a year, more than any other month. Those who go west through the Panama Canal may expect in the waters west of Mexico about one storm a month of which about one-half attain hurricane intensity.
