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Weather Forecasting! Many who read the weather forecasts up in the ear of their newspapers have no way of knowing how forecasts are made. It takes, in the United States and Canada, about 300 observation stations to make a good forecasting service. At these stations observations are made regularly four times a day which observations are sent to all forecasting stations. Four weather maps and other auxiliary charts are made from the observations twice or more daily and are ready about one hour after observation times. The forecaster must then study all the charts and data and issue forecasts covering every corner of his district.
