Weather and airplanes! When Mr. Hughes and his companions drove his airplane 200 miles an hour across the Atlantic Ocean, he could easily have overtaken and passed all the cyclones on the Atlantic. These cyclones, or storm areas, only travel in summer the average rate of 24 miles an hour over land and 17 miles over the north Atlantic. The "pick-a-back" plane coming this way and against the eastward movement of the storm would pass more than Mr. Hughes.
