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September on the Atlantic! Those who cross this month may have a more exciting time than in summer. Cyclones, and hence gales, are on the increase, but even at that the weather is mostly fair on the northern route. In the southern latitudes, however, the peak of hurricane occurrence is reached. They average about three a month, but no dependence can be placed on that, as some Septembers have none, while others have as many as five. When hurricanes do occur they advance with considerable energy into northern waters. There is less fog along New England and Newfoundland but more near the Azores.
