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Sailing the Pacific! Temperatures remain practically unchanged in the northern Pacific, varying from 52 to 65 degrees. The winter type of storms is beginning to make its appearance, but while some rough weather may be expected, especially in the latter part of the month, the average is for good weather. In the western part of the route the storms encountered, if any, are those incident to the region and those from the tropics. The middle latitudes are quite free from all storms except those of tropical origin. In the southern route occur the typhoons of the Far East and tropical cyclones on the west coast of Mexico. Fogs may be expected along the northern route and on west coast from Vancouver to lower California.
