Equinox! The sun today at both the North and South Poles neither rises nor sets, but simply circles around the horizon. This is because the sun today shines directly overhead at the equator which it crosses at noon on its journey south. There may be storms in parts of the northern hemisphere, but they are not caused by this phenomenon; they simply mark the beginning of our winter storms. At one place observations taken for 50 years showed that there were fewer gales and storms from the 21st to the 25th of September and of March than during the preceding and succeeding five days.
