Fishing weather! Fishermen argue a good deal about the merits of sunshiny and cloudy days. One fisherman makes a good catch of rainbow trout on a sunshiny day, while another has no luck until sundown. On the whole they prefer a day streaked with clouds and sunshine. Some study the color of the water as reflected from the sky. Others study their flies. One maxim runs: "A dull day, a bright fly: a bright day, a dull fly." A good catch probably depends upon so many factors that no trustworthy generalization can be drawn from a few instances.
