Frosts! The first killing frosts very definitely put an end to all growth for the season. By the end of the present month these will have visited the entire country except the states bordering on the Gulf of Mexico and parts of Arizona and California. The actual time that the first killing frost comes to any place may be several days ahead of the average date, thus killing all flowers and late vegetables; but on the other hand killing frost may be delayed several days, or even two weeks. The average length of the growing season is calculated as from the last date of killing frost in the spring to the first in autumn. -----
