Radiant heating! Open fires were the first form of artificial heating employed by our ancestors. Open fires heat by virtue of their sending out invisible heat waves which, striking persons or other objects, warm them. This form of heat is called "radiant heating," and is used today by installing in rooms panels heated by gas, electricity, or otherwise. These panels are of two types: those heated to about 500 degrees and located high on walls so that accidental burning is prevented, and those heated to about 160 degrees and located nearer the floor. These panels radiate heat very effectively. -----
