Extension of meteorology! Probably no other single factor has been so instrumental in increasing the interest in weather science and in extending the old weather services and establishing new ones as aviation. The extension of the weather services has reached that altruistic point where there is an exchange of weather data between the various services of the world, which greatly increases the efficiency of each and all of them. New phases of the weather have been studied as conditions which cause bad visibility, formation of fog, mist, rain, snow, and icing on planes.
