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Winter cyclones! This type of storms is now upon us. As to origin there are various groups: one group appears in the extreme Northwest, another on the south Pacific coast, one from Colorado, and still another from Texas. Despite their origin, they all cross this country or lower Canada, following many paths, but all converge on the Middle and New England states. They travel much faster than the summer types, taking about four days to cross the country. In general, if they follow the southern route, the temperature east of the Rockies will be colder; and if the northern route, then the weather will be warmer.

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
