Twenty-four hour weather service! Thirty years ago, when aviation was in its infancy, no one ever thought of a 24-hour weather service. This is now the rule along the Federal Airways System. It is not only convenient but absolutely necessary for the safety of air travel. More than 500 weather stations have been established along this system in the United States, Hawaii and Alaska, and others are being established as required. At 52 terminals the United States Weather Bureau has installed first-order stations where trained meteorologists are on duty all hours of the day and night. They make four weather maps daily, and, in addition to the regular forecasts, also issue special forecasts when weather conditions render it necessary.
