Economics of wind! We have to thank the wind for many of the larger characteristics of our climate. According to its direction, wind brings to us the cold of the North and the warmth of the South, thus bringing about a more uniform temperature to the earth than would otherwise be the case. Wind carries the moisture of the sea inland, especially where there are no mountain barriers to interfere. The cold north and northwest winds of the winter season bring vigor to man, insure nature's ice crop, which is still being used; and they stimulate all industries which cater to the business of keeping us warm.
