Christmas weather! How should Santa Claus clothe himself at Christmas time? Weather differs greatly over North America. In far-away Alaska on the Pacific coast, he may stroll along the roof tops comfortably enough in a topcoat, for the temperatures there hover around the freezing point. But on the Arctic Alaskan coast and in northern Canada he will want to wear all he owns to combat 50 degrees below zero. He will need less change on the Pacific coast than on the Atlantic. On the former there is only 40 degrees difference between the Aleutian Islands and Panama, while on the Atlantic coast there may be 100 degrees difference between Greenland and Florida. -----
