How cold is it? The householder often desires to know the outside temperature. Contrary to common belief and practice, it is not easy to measure accurately the temperature of the free air. A thermometer simply indicates its own temperature, and the problem is to get it to take on the temperature of the air. To do this, whirl the thermometer in the shade for a minute or so and then read it quickly. Better still, hang it up in a thermometer shelter, which is a box with sides like outside window shutters. If you want to read your thermometer from the inside, attach it to a bracket on the outside of a north window.
