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Ocean drift! There is a museum at Alexandrovsk, Russia, on the shores of the Arctic Ocean, where among other things borne there by the Gulf Stream and carefully catalogued are branches of tropical trees, whole crowns of palm trees, name-boards of wrecked vessels, and objects probably tossed overboard from vessels at sea. After every bad West Indian hurricane may be found enough objects carried there by the Gulf Stream to compute its rate of flow, which is about 80 miles a day. The main factors causing ocean currents are differences in temperature of the ocean waters and the permanent winds of the earth.
