Gardens in midwinter! The home gardener may perform his duties leisurely during this month of greatest cold. Except in the South no outside work need be done, but plans can be put on paper; and one should take advantage of experience gained during the past season. Seeds may be ordered, also fertilizer and new tools. Old tools should be repaired, sharpened and painted. In the South smooth peas and broad beans may be planted as soon as the ground can be worked. Radishes and lettuce may be sown late this month. And in the extreme South potatoes may be planted and onions set out.
