Snow removal! In addition to equipment this requires first of all employees who combine faithfulness, skill and courage to combat snow sometimes falling one foot an hour, gales drifting the snow into hard masses, temperatures at times down to 30 degrees below, and occasionally snowslides. The equipment consists of all kinds of plows, tractors, trucks and power shovels. Preliminary work is done in late fall, erecting miles of snow fences which have been folded up and stored away since spring. Radio stations, both permanent and movable, are used to enable the engineers to supervise the work efficiently. To this must be added well-heated and comfortable bunk houses for the men, and heated quarters and adequate repair shops for the equipment.
