Snowfall! Our climatologists, by a scientific consideration of climatic data, now deduce not only that the whole world is becoming warmer but also that the snowfall is diminishing. A study of the snowfall for the city of Washington, D.C., shows diminishing snow for the last half century. This reversal of opinion is due not only to a keener interpretation of the data but also because the records are longer. No one can say, however, when the pendulum of climatic change may swing the other way bringing lower temperatures and again the "old-fashioned winter."
