Snow an asset! Snow is not considered an asset in cities where its removal is a major problem, but it is in New Hampshire, which is the winter playground of New England so far as skiing is concerned. There, as in most of the northeastern portion of this country and southeastern Canada, the winter's snowfall averages from 65 to over 120 inches. Skiing may be enjoyed from November to June in places like the Tuckerman Ravine, and in all places, over 2000 feet above sea level from December to April. Snowfall tends to increase with altitude at the rate of one inch for every 17 feet of elevation. There is, however, much variation to this figure due to exposure and other factors. March is considered the best month for skiing.
