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The uneasy atmosphere! When one is in the midst of a calm it is not difficult to imagine that it is calm everywhere. But such is not the case. The areas of calm at any time are not large compared with the surface of the whole earth. If a quantity of air moves in any direction whatsoever, it can not do so without causing air back or in front of it to move also. Air currents have been traced and the extent of their journeys is amazing. Air has been known to travel in six days from Spitzbergen to the west coast of Africa to join the northeast trades. Again, wind off South Ireland was traced back to north Africa, while two days later practically the same region was fed by wind that came from the Hudson Bay via the Azores.
