International weather reports! Weather is a world problem and recognizes no artificial boundaries. This was known to meteorologists a long time ago. To further the study of the weather and the forecasting thereof there is an exchange of weather reports between all countries maintaining weather services. This cooperation exists nowhere so completely as between Canada and the United States. The weather services of these two countries maintain complete and most amicable relations. Reports of Canadian observations of the weather are received in the United States as promptly as in Toronto, and the United States reports are sent as promptly to Toronto.
