Late spring frosts! The average date of the last killing frosts of spring varies from February 15 in the extreme South to as late as May 20 or even June 1 in the extreme northern portion of the United States and southeastern Canada. But killing frosts have been recorded as late as March 20 in the South and June 20 in the North. So it is seen that the date of the last killing frost may depart very considerably from the average. Farmers plant some crops two weeks before the average date, and some two weeks after, while others watch the advance of the wild vegetation and plan accordingly; the Indians used to have some such rule.
