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Weather on the high seas! Those who contemplate an ocean voyage next May will in general have a pleasant one. The weather over the North Atlantic in May is more moderate than in April. Storms of the winter type, while occurring, are less severe. A journey to Europe, where the season is somewhat more advanced than ours, is likely to be free from serious discomfort. Fogs, however, are on the increase from the Grand Banks to Virginia and may be expected about half the time in the former area. Over the South Atlantic the northeast trades will have increased in intensity and steadiness, but gales will be infrequent south of the 35th parallel, and May is the pleasantest month of the year for voyaging in the West Indies.
