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Fog drops! When we can not see objects 1000 feet away, due to the fog, the weather is called "foggy"; this condition is a great hazard to ships of the air and sea. Researchers are studying the size, number and composition of fog drops, a knowledge of which will aid greatly in determining how to dissipate fog locally. They find that there are about 80 fog particles per cubic inch, and the drops vary in size from one ten-thousandth to five thousandths of an inch in diameter. The water content is, of course, very small: one-tenth of an ounce for every 1000 cubic feet of space.
