Campers and water supply! Campers may get pure water by catching rain from the sky but even when available this source is not convenient. Lake water and mountain streams are generally potable but river water is not, because of the refuse thrown into the rivers and to some extent of the run-off water picking up impurities from the soil. Shallow wells may be vitiated but deep wells and springs generally furnish good water that has been purified by filtration through several feet of earth. The camper, if in doubt, can always make water good by boiling it a few minutes. In times of flood, when water is most plentiful, the order is to boil all water for drinking.
