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A northern summer resort! Labrador may seem a bleak place, but anyone who enjoys an invigorating, outdoor holiday with plenty of fishing and scenery will find it there. It is warmer than interior Canada, but even at that the coasts are ice-bound up to mid-June. There are, however, no fogs except at the strait of Belle Isle. The summer temperature ranges from 30 to 80 degrees on the coast and from 45 to 90 degrees inland, with occasional night frosts. Sunshine is abundant and rainfall is scanty, seldom interfering with a day of sport. The weather continues good throughout July, August and September. The geese begin to fly south in August, and snow begins to fall in the northern part in September.
