Home gardens! Although killing frosts have been known to occur in June in the northeastern United States, southeastern Canada and along the Great Lakes, they are rare. As a calendar guide to the gardener, it is suggested that in the North he should continue to plant sweet corn, bush beans, beets, carrots, and kohlrabi, and sow rutabaga, turnips and late beets for winter. Start pumpkins, squash, and melons if not done last month. Set out celery plants, first soaking the ground.
