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Canada's rainfall! From 184 inches at Surf Inlet, B.C., to only about 13 inches in southern Alberta is the range of Canada's annual rainfall. There are five types of rainfall recognized in that country. That on the Pacific coast has decided maximum in early winter, while in the interior of British Columbia the rainfall is distributed very evenly throughout the year. The Plains type of rainfall prevails over the greater portion of interior Canada. This type has a decided summer maximum, most of the rain falling from May to August, which helps the great grain growing region. Then there is the St. Lawrence type of even distribution throughout the year, and the Nova Scotia type with a pronounced maximum in the winter months.
