Protection from tornadoes! If one sees a tornado coming, one should not immediately run, but stop and carefully observe its direction of motion. Then run in a direction at right angles to the direction that the storm is moving. It is best to go to the north or northwest side of the tornado which are the less dangerous sides. The best place, however, is in a properly constructed "cyclone cellar", one that is provided with tools to dig out if it happens to get covered with debris caused by the storm. The southwest corner of a cellar of a frame house is next best, but beware of the ordinary brick house. If no house is near lie flat down in some depression.
