Air pilots! Sailors, farmers and air pilots are among the professional classes who use their weather lore constantly in their work, and many of them are good meteorologists. A knowledge of weather is essential to the air pilot; he is more "on his own" than the sea captain who can, in case of a bad storm, throw out a sea anchor and "let her ride." The airplane pilot's weather instruction should begin before he touches the "stick." He should know, and they do know, enough about the weather to discuss with the professional meteorologist the present and future weather along the line of a proposed flight. This means he must know the structure of the atmosphere, the mechanics of storms and how to judge the present weather appearances.
