Weather and the garden! The average temperatures for August for inland stations of United States and Canada are one or two degrees lower than for July, but those on the coasts are about the same or slightly warmer for August. In the North, very early beets, kohlrabi, and radishes may be sown. Onions should be pulled as soon as the tops begin to ripen, and then aired by allowing them to lie on the ground for two or three days; further drying may be continued in a well-ventilated room. Tomatoes may be slow ripening; if so, put in straw in a cold frame with glass in place. Continue the dusting of potatoes and other vegetables.
