Climate of Poland! Poland lies far enough to the east and away from the ameliorating influence of the Atlantic Ocean to have a continental climate; that is, slightly more severe than that of Germany but less severe than that of Russia in the same latitudes. The climate of Warsaw, nearly in the center of Poland, is typical of the whole country. It has an average of 25.9 degrees in January, the coldest month, with a record of 37.6 degrees below zero for the minimum. Rivers are ice-bound for two or three months. July is the warmest month, 64.8 degrees average, and 95 degrees for the highest. The precipitation is light, only 22 inches a year, mostly falling in the summer months.
