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The bora! There are certain winds that have long been known locally by certain names. The bora, for instance, named from Boreas, is a cold north wind, as its name implies. It occurs in the Adriatic sea region. It is of cyclonic origin; that is, it occurs when there is a certain distribution of "highs" and "lows" around Italy. In the case of the bora, the "low", or cyclone, lies over the southern Adriatic which draws the cold air south from interior Europe making the bora. It is much the same as the norther of North America which occurs when a "low" passes to the east, drawing down on its western side cold air from the interior of Canada forming a norther or cold wave.
