Admiral Byrd's automobile! No matter how low the temperature may fall, man seems to be able to stand the cold if there is no wind. But winds are frequent in the South Pole region, and temperatures down to 78 degrees below were experienced in Byrd's two previous expeditions. The use, therefore, by Admiral Byrd of an enclosed automobile will permit him and his fellow explorers to continue to travel under all conditions of cold and wind provided the visibility does not get too bad. If blizzards arise, as they will, the explorers will simply wait; whereas if they traveled on foot, they would be obliged to dig in until the storm passed.
