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Evidence of climatic changes! The question is often asked what is the nature of the evidence supporting the claim that there have been great changes in climate in the past. The evidence is geological, and of two types: first, there are fossil remains of both plants and animals; second, there are certain physical features on surface rocks. The evidence of plants and animals has to be very carefully weighed as both may have changed their habits, that is, they may have originally developed in a warm climate and afterwards become accustomed to a cold one. The evidence of old land surfaces, such as glacier scratches, old salt beds, and so on, are more easily interpreted. -----
