Indoor climate! Much has already been done in modifying indoor conditions for greater comfort. There seems to be, however, a limit to which modification may be pushed because of the danger of making too great a contrast between indoor and outdoor conditions. Air conditioning has done much for comfort and to raise the vigor and consequently the production of workers. Relief has also been obtained through filtering the air and securing the proper amount of humidity. Since Americans owe much of their energy to the changeability of the climate, it is probable that too uniform conditions may not be so effectual as changes from day to day or from hour to hour.
