Ice harvest! The harvesting of ice still continues to be an industry of some importance in spite of new refrigeration methods. The United States imports a few thousand tons from both Canada and Mexico. This year the Weather Bureau reports that natural ice is being rapidly harvested and stored. Thicknesses from 8 to 24 inches have been reported in the northern states. There is no lack of ice in the world if it could only be harvested and transported economically. Many of the small rivers in the northern part of Canada freeze clear to their bottoms. Ice caps and glaciers hold enormous quantities. The Greenland ice cap is over 700,000 square miles in area and several thousand feet thick.
