Temperature! Now that the sun is again coming north, it will control the temperature more and more as spring advances. No single reading of the thermometer, no matter how well exposed, will tell the whole story of outside temperature. The temperature of the air five feet above the ground may be 60 degrees, while black or dark pavement may be 80 degrees, and nearby grass only 70 degrees and even lower if in the shade. Since different substances absorb and radiate heat differently, they all may have, at any instant, temperatures different from that of the air and from each other.
