Drying the cellar! To dry out a house or cellar select the day having the best weather for the job. Therefore open all windows and doors on a sunny day when the wind is from the north or northwest. This is because the air from that direction is driest, coming as it does from the northern interior of the continent. And as this air blows farther south, it warms up, making it drier still, that is, its humidity will be less than it originally was. To dry a cellar the outside air should preferably be cooler than the cellar air, because otherwise the incoming air might be cooled below its dewpoint and deposit water on the cellar walls.
