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Dew! Although Aristotle made the keen observation that dew appears on calm, serene nights, it was not until 2000 years later that Wm. Chas. Wells of England gave the scientific explanation of the formation of dew. This was in 1815. Dr. Wells explained that dew forms most copiously on clear, calm nights; it also may form in lesser degree on nights with some wind and clouds. He found that objects upon which dew formed were colder than the surrounding air, and that dew did not fall but that the moisture in the air next the objects condensed upon them.
