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Winds! In spite of the fact that there is only one cause (differences of temperature coupled with gravity) for the wind, a survey indicates that there are probably over 500 different names for winds in the world. These names indicate winds common to a particular region. A few of the more familiar are: the "bora," a cold northeasterly wind of the north Adriatic Sea; the "chinook," a warm, dry wind of western United States and Canada; the "solano," a hot, dusty and moist southeasterly or easterly wind on the coast of Spain; the "simoon," a hot, dry wind or whirlwind of the deserts of Africa and Arabia; and the "bize," a cold, dry wind of the mountainous region of southern France blowing from the northerly quarters.
