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Longe range forecasting! Three hundred years ago Francis Bacon, the great English philosopher and essayist, suggested a 35-year weather cycle which was later investigated and is now known as the Bruckner cycle. This and other cycles for forecasting the weather is based on the idea that weather repeats itself. It does to a great extent, but not regularly enough to make it possible to satisfactorily forecast by cycles. There are now about as many cycles as advocates, and one is about as good as another for predicting the weather. When a good method for forecasting the weather more than two or three days has been found, it will probably be much more complex than the simple arithmetic of the cycle method.
