Extremes of temperature! From about 100 degrees above to 40 degrees below is about the range of temperature most people in temperate latitudes may experience. But life in some of its forms can exist at temperatures 300 above and as low as 459 degrees below zero which is as low as temperature can go and where all motion of molecules ceases. The highest recorded free air temperature is 136 degrees, that on the surface of the sun is about 10,000 degrees, and in its interior 70 million degrees. The highest temperature believed possible and obtained by calculation is 5 trillion degrees which is, of course, only a theoretical value as is that of the sun's interior.
