Abnormal weather! To find good and sufficient reasons for abnormal weather is no easier than to trace out all the reasons for normal or so-called seasonable weather. Some are satisfied that the war, radio waves, or a supposed change in the Gulf Stream are adequate explanations for any abnormality of the weather. Even an experienced meteorologist cannot explain all weather conditions. Many physical forces, which never seem to act in exactly the same measure the second time, cause the weather and weather changes. Some immediate causes may be obvious; others, probably just as important, are less obvious. The ultimate cause probably lies in the sun's radiation, but the interactions are very complex.
